Mission Statement:

MHS provides a rigorous liberal arts academic program. We prepare graduates for a college of choice and empower students to set and reach meaningful goals. MHS also supports and embraces teacher leadership and provides an extensive professional development program based on content, pedagogy, youth development and advisement.

Admissions:

MHS is a small, screened public high school in lower Manhattan. Students are admitted based on a review of grades, attendance and punctuality, and standardized exam scores. Admissions preference is given to students who live or attend school south of Houston Street in Manhattan. In the 2018-2019 school year, we received over 6,000 applications for 170 freshman seats.

- * 90% average in core academic courses
- * 10 or fewer combined absences and lateness
- * Level 3 or 4 on standardized exams

Advisory:

An important part of life at MHS is its Advisory system. All new students are assigned to an Advisory that remains together through 12th grade. Advisory meets three times per week for all four years of high school. The advisor is the student's advocate in the building and functions as the primary contact with parents. All advisors have 18 to 22 students in their Advisory and remain with their group for four years.

Academic Program:

All MHS students take four years of English, social studies, mathematics, and science, as well as three years of foreign language (Spanish and Mandarin currently offered). There are two to three hours of homework each night and 20 hours of annual community service to fulfill.

9th and 10th Grade:

In 9th and 10th grade, the core curriculum establishes a foundation of critical thinking skills and features key content infused into all classes. The core 9/10 academic sequence includes English, biology, chemistry, global history, math, foreign language, and art as well as physical education and health.

11th and 12th Grade:

11th and 12th grade students express preference for electives and may apply for Advanced Placement courses including Biology, Chemistry, English Literature and Composition, English Language and Composition, U.S. History, World History, and Studio Art. Math and science courses include Algebra II, Pre-calculus, AP Calculus AB, Physics, Advanced Physics, Environmental Science, and Engineering Design. Students may enroll in the *College Now* program at Baruch, BMCC, and other CUNY colleges for simultaneous high school and college credit. There are also elective courses in art including photography, graphic design and mixed media.
